No entries will be accepted prior to this postmark date. Entries must have clearly visible USPS postmark. No metered mail allowed. No FedEx, DHL, UPS, telephone, email or faxed entries. Express or overnight entries will be accepted only if signature is waived. After close of entries, refunds will be issued only if there is a waiting list and someone takes your run. # STOCK INFO:

Ducks: 5 head of Welsh Harlequins and Australian Spotted Duck

Sheep: 3 to 5 head of Dorper-cross Sheep

Cattle: 3 to 5 head of beef cattle

Replacement value: Cattle - fair market value, ducks - \$40, sheep \$200.00

<u>AWARDS:</u> Placement ribbons 1st - 4th. Rosettes for HIT and/or High in class. Miscellaneous awards for HIT and High Combined

GENERAL: This trial will be run under ASCA rules and regulations: https://www.asca.org/wp-content/uploads/2016/04/StockdogRules.pdf
Central Texas Working ASA reserve the right to substitute a judge, if necessary. Run order will be determined by random drawing and posted before the trial begins.

Bitches in season will run in draw order and must remain crated when not competing.

Ties are broken by time. Questions or conflicts should immediately be brought to the attention of the Course Director.

## RESPONSIBILITIES

Owners of dogs will be responsible for all injuries to livestock. At stock owners option, dogs' owner will pay for veterinary services or, if necessary, replacement cost. Cattle = Fair market value, Sheep = \$200/head, Ducks = \$40/head.

Owners/handlers are responsible for their dog(s). Dogs must always be crated or on lead, except when competing. Please clean up after your dogs. Children must always be under direct adult supervision.

Central Texas Working ASC, its' officers and members, Tom Peshock, and Shertom Kennels assume no responsibility for any loss damage or injury sustained by an exhibitor, handler, dog, property, child or spectator. Trialing is inherently dangerous. Ground/footing is uneven. Knowing this, you assume full liability for yourself, dog, and stock if any damage is caused by you or your dog to stock or others.

#### **ENTRIES & FEES**

No telephone, facsimile, email or incomplete entries will be accepted. All entries must be on ASCA entry forms with proper fees included, i.e., check, cashiers check or money order. Entry form at: https://www.asca.org/wp-content/uploads/2016/04/stockentwfill.pdf

The entry limit per Judge will be accepted in postmark order. If a class of stock is full the dog will be put on a waiting list in order or receipt.

Entries received postmarked after pre-entry closing date will be placed on the waiting list in postmarked order. Additions will be made prior to the start of the trial from the waiting list and are at the discretion of CTWASC. Substitutions will be allowed with the following restriction: the substitute dog must be owned by the original entrant.

## Fee Schedule

Pre entries: Cattle \$40, Sheep \$30, Ducks \$20

Day of entries if available: Cattle \$50, Sheep \$40, Ducks \$25

Entry fees will not be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified by a judge, or barred from competition by the trial committee. Entry fees will be refunded if excused in writing by a veterinarian.

Entry fees will not be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire and/or dangerous weather conditions, acts of God, public emergencies, acts of public enemy, strikes or other causes beyond the control of CTWASC.

Selling runs is not permitted unless the trial is full. If the trial is full and you wish to sell a run, the transaction must be handled by the trial secretary. All offers to buy or sell runs must be submitted to the trial secretary at least one hour before the trial starts. Any checks returned for insufficient funds will be considered a void entry. There is a \$35 service charge for returned checks. If entries are resubmitted, payment must be in the form of cash, Money Order or Cashiers' Check.

This trial is open to all ASCA approved herding breeds. Non-ASCA dogs may enter the stock trial without a tracking number, however, only those with a tracking number will be awarded ASCA titles upon completing title requirements. #### Directions to the Trial Site (From the east at IH 35 at Georgetown)

Towns in order along Hwy. 29 heading west from Georgetown: Liberty Hill, Bertram, Burnet Take Hwy 29 to Bertram. In the middle of town at the only signal light, turn North (right) onto RR 243/RR1174 also called Grange Street. Go 4/10 of a mile and turn left onto RR 1174 North. Go 7.6 miles and turn right onto County Road 210A. Go 6/10 mile. The road curves to the left and then to the right. We are the second property on the right at 601 County Road 210A, Destiny Farm. If gate is closed, it can remain open.

## Directions from the Hotels in Burnet to trial site

Go North on Hwy. 281 and turn east on RR 963/County Road 200. Then take RR 963 north for approximately 10.5 miles. Turn right or south onto RR 1174 and go just over 1 mile and turn left onto County Road 210A. We are the second property on the right with the sign reading Destiny Farm at 601 CR 210A on the gate.
